The youth's strengths and needs are targeted to create an individual program with the intention of benefits to both the youth and their community. JHS Youth Justice Committee (Funded by the Ministry of the Attorney General) The Youth Justice Committee involves trained community members who meet with victims, young people 12 to 17 years of age accused of minor, non-violent offences, and their parents, to negotiate an appropriate way for the young person to make amends for his or her actions. The Committee may develop and implement alternatives to formal court proceedings, either on referral by police or the Crown. Examples of alternate interventions include community service, restitution and counselling programs. All young people must agree to accept responsibility for their actions, and to apologize to the victim. ### HRIC – Provincial Youth Outreach Worker (YOW) Program

The purpose of the Provincial Youth Outreach Worker (YOW) program is to help marginalized and at-risk youth (12-25) and families better navigate and connect with services and pro social opportunities in their communities to improve youth outcomes. The program focuses on at-risk youth who live in an identified priority communities and/or belong to a distinct priority population (e.g. Syrian specific). These youth may experience increased barriers in accessing the opportunities that can help them to develop their capacity to make healthy life choices and achieve their goals.

The Provincial YOW program in Hamilton and Brantford is *funded by the Ministry of Children, Community, and Social Services (MCCSS) and led by Wesley. The Hamilton YOW team works in partnership with Good Shepherd and the Hamilton Regional Indian Centre.*
